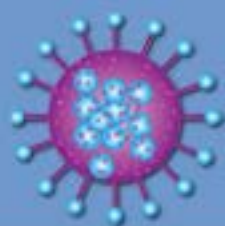


WARNING, THIS VIRUS IS DEADLY

So how do dogs get Parvovirus?



Unvaccinated Dogs poop out millions of virus particles



Virus particles are **very stable** in soil - they resist heat & cold



Virus particles present in soil can stay there for **years**



Unvaccinated Dogs who walk on contaminated soil, lick their feet afterwards and ingest the virus

Symptoms to look out for:

If you notice any of the following signs, seek medical attention from your nearest vet immediately!

- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Loss of appetite
- Lethargy/Weakness
- Fever & Dehydration

Prevention is better than cure & you don't have to lose your dog to Parvo

- DON'T WAIT UNTIL ITS TOO LATE** - even if your dog does not leave your garden
- This virus can be picked up on your shoes and you can take it into your garden
 - Puppies & young adults are at a higher risk you **MUST** vaccinate your puppy before exposing them to any outside areas
 - Puppies need a series of vaccinations to develop immunity
 - Adult dogs need yearly vaccinations to maintain immunity
